"The SBI noted the requests from non-Annex I Parties for further technical support aimed at improving their domestic capacity to facilitate continuity in meeting reporting requirements through training on the use of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) 2006 IPCC Guidelines for National Greenhouse Gas Inventories, building sustainable national greenhouse gas inventory management systems, and understanding and applying best practices relevant to the setting up of domestic measurement, reporting and verification systems. It encouraged the secretariat, in coordination with UNEP and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), to make every effort to ensure that the relevant training is made available to all non-Annex I Parties."


Memorandum of Understanding between UNFCCC and IPCC

- MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING between the secretariat of the UNFCCC secretariat and the secretariat of the IPCC was signed on 22 January 2016 to, among other things, collaborate in responding to the mandate given to the UNFCCC secretariat by the SBI at its forty-second session.
- Enhanced collaboration between the UNFCCC and IPCC, including with regard the development of the IPCC inventory software.



UNFCCC Regional Hands-on Training Workshops: 2015 – 2016 and Beyond

The UNFCCC regional hands-on training workshops are conducted in collaboration with partner organization (IPCC) and the CGE, using IPCC and CGE training materials.



 Primary objective: providing tools to establish or strengthen national institutional arrangements to support enhanced reporting of *national GHG inventories*, linking it with the use of the 2006 IPCC Guidelines.



Building Sustainable GHG Inventory Management Systems, and Use of 2006 IPCC Guidelines

- 2 days on National Institutional Arrangements
 - Use of the six US-EPA templates referred to in 2012 CGE training materials
 - 1 Institutional arrangements (IA)
 - 2 Methods, data and documentation (MDD)
 - 3 Quality assurance and quality control (QA/QC)
 - 4 Archiving documentation (AD)
 - 5 Key category analysis (KCA)
 - 6 National inventory improvement plan (NIIP)
 - Dissemination of US-EPA tools/templates in various languages
 - MoU and confidentiality agreement (confidentiality agreement amendment; MoU; contact form for supplemental information; inception memorandum; sample statement of work)
 - Roles and responsibilities (for each sector)
 - Example of completed template workbook
- 3 days on the use of the 2006 IPCC Guidelines, including inventory software



On-line Training and Certification on 2006 IPCC Guidelines

- Following each regional training workshop on institutional arrangements and use of 2006 IPCC guidelines, <u>subject to availability</u> <u>of funds</u>, the UNFCCC Secretariat will enrol national experts to elearning and certification courses of the Greenhouse Gas Management Institute (GHG MI) on 2006 IPCC Guidelines for national GHG inventories (up to 10 persons per country per year).
- The UNFCCC secretariat will, <u>subject to availability of funds</u>, translate the GHG MI e-learning courses on 2006 IPCC Guidelines into French and Spanish.
- Programme to support regional workshops as well as on-line training and certification of national experts planned to run from 2016 to 2021.
- No funding is currently available to support these workshops and on-line training and certification programme.
