

#### Scope of the technical analysis of BURs

#### Decision 20/CP.19, annex, paragraph 15

The technical analysis under international consultation and analysis will **aim to <u>increase</u> transparency** of mitigation actions and their effects; discussion on the appropriateness of such domestic policies and measures is not part of the process. The TTE shall:

- (a) **Identify the extent** to which the elements of information listed in paragraph 3(a) of the guidelines contained in decision 2/CP.17, annex IV, are included in the BUR of the Party concerned;
- (b) **Undertake a technical analysis** of information contained in the BUR as outlined in the "UNFCCC biennial update reporting guidelines for Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention" contained in annex III to decision 2/CP.17, and any additional technical information that may be provided by the Party concerned;
- (c) In consultation with the Party concerned, identify capacity-building needs in order to facilitate reporting in accordance with annex III to decision 2/CP.17, and participating in international consultation and analysis in accordance with annex IV to decision 2/CP.17, taking into account Article 4, paragraph 3, of the Convention.



## Facilitating the technical analysis under ICA - training programmes for TTE

**GOAL:** Seeks to enhance the **proficiency** of **nominated technical experts** by providing a comprehensive overview of principles, guidelines, procedures and modalities, and methodologies involved in undertaking a technical analysis of BURs under the ICA process

#### **Objectives**

Strengthening the required knowledge on the reporting requirements for developing country Parties, stemming from the relevant decisions and provisions of the Convention

Enhancing the necessary technical skills to understand the approaches involved in generating and reporting information in the BUR, in accordance with the guidelines contained in annex III to decision 2/CP.17

Providing the necessary knowledge to undertake the technical analysis, taking into account the differing national circumstances of developing country Parties, and to prepare, in consultation with the Party concerned, the summary report



## Facilitating the technical analysis under ICA - training programmes for TTE

#### The CGE designed and developed a draft training programme covering:

- The relevant provisions of the Convention and decisions of the COP on reporting national communications and BURs from non-Annex I Parties, and the ICA, including technical analysis of BURs, which may contain data and information on the results of activities referred to in decision 1/CP.16, paragraph 70 (referred to as REDD-plus) in a technical annex
- Science, methods and approaches involved in preparing and reporting information in the BUR
  - Greenhouse gas emissions by sources and removals by sinks
  - Mitigation actions and their effects
  - Constraints and gaps, and related finance, technological and capacity building needs and support received
- To ensure that the training materials fully respond to the needs of the technical analysis
  of BURs, the CGE decided to subject the draft materials to peer review by experts who are
  actively engaged in the process and the preparation of national communications and/or
  BURs
- The peer review workshop was held in Bonn, Germany, on 26 27 October 2014
- The CGE considered the feedback from the expert which formed as a basis for the ongoing revision of the training materials



### II. Facilitating the technical analysis under ICA – selection of the TTE

In the selection of the members of the TTE, the secretariat will be guided by the CGE which will provide periodic advice to assist the secretariat to fulfill the criteria for selection as contained in paragraphs 3 to 5 of annex to decision 20/CP.19:

- Shall be nominated to the UNFCCC roster of experts
- Have the relevant expertise needed to cover the areas in the BUR
- Successfully completed the CGE training programme
- Balance at least 1/3 of the TTE, priority to past CGE members
- Majority from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention
- Geographic balance from Annex I Parties and non-Annex I Parties
- Two co-leads, one from Annex I Party and another from a non-Annex I Party

The secretariat shall report to the CGE on the composition of the TTE on a semi-annual basis



## II. Facilitating the technical analysis under ICA - training of the TTE


In operation since second quarter of 2015.

- The first training and competency assessment for the TTE took place in May 2015.
- The training programme primarily targets those experts registered in the UNFCCC roster of experts.

- Successfully completed similar training programme, offered by the secretariat, relating to review of any of the themes covered in national communications, GHG inventories or biennial reports from Annex I Parties.


#### Less experienced expert

- No experience of participating in the review of national communications, GHG inventories or biennial reports from Annex I Parties.
- OR
- Limited or no prior knowledge on the any of the themes covered in biennial update reports from non-Annex I Parties.






#### **Proficiency assessment**

- Online through the UNFCCC Learning Management System (LMS)
- A **set of questions** prepared by the CGE, with the assistance of the secretariat
  - multiple choice (15 questions)
  - two questions that require narrative answers of 100-250 words
- For each round of assessment, different questions will be prepared and used
- Participants are expected to sit for only those modules that they undertook through selflearning
- Grading will be done by the secretariat
- The participants will need to score, at least, 60% to be deemed as successful completion of the module
- The secretariat will on the periodic-basis prepare and submit a factual report to the CGE providing an overview of the moderation of the proficiency assessment and grading of the papers
