

Relevant Article of the Convention



- Decision 1/CP.16 Cancun
 - National communications
 - Frequency: 4 years
 - Biennial Update Reports
- Decision 2/CP.17- Durban
 - Submission of first BUR by December 2014
 - Subsequently every 2 years
 - 1. Summary of parts of NC 2. Stand alone update report
 - Inventory year
 - Minimum, no more than four years prior to the date of submission or more recent
 - Subsequent...does not precede by more than four years
 - First round of the ICA (non Annex I) will commence within six months of submission of the first round of BUR
 - To review and revise the modalities and guidelines as appropriate, in accordance with decisions of the COP

Modalities and guidelines for ICA



- ICA aims to <u>increase the transparency</u> of mitigation actions and their effects
- ICA is <u>non-intrusive</u>, <u>non-punitive</u> and <u>respectful of national</u> <u>sovereignty</u>



Modalities and guidelines for ICA (cont)



- (a) That the first rounds of ICA will be conducted for developing Parties, commencing within <u>six months of the submission of the first round of biennial update reports by developing country Parties;</u>
- (b) That the frequency of participation in subsequent rounds of ICA by developing Parties, based on <u>their respective capabilities and national circumstances</u>, and <u>special flexibility</u> for small island developing States and the least developed country Parties, will be determined by the frequency of the submission of BURs;
- (c) To revise the modalities and guidelines prescribed herein based on experiences gained in the first round of ICA, no later than 2017;
- (d) That small island developing States and the least developed country Parties may undergo ICA as a group of Parties at their discretion.



Challenges for NAI Parties



- NAI Parties need to submit BUR continuously.
- Not only submissions, but also ICA will be conducted.
- ICA is first time for NAI Parties.
- UNFCCC secretariat will provide Updates of NCs, BURs and ICA in international negotiations in this session.
- UNEP will provide the information of support for NCs and BURs.
